Theme - a message an author is trying to make about life or human

existence that applies to most people outside of the text.

A theme or message may suggest ...

Topics

- An insightful, universal truth about the world, life or people in general
- how people should behave, react in certain situations, treat others or live their lives and the consequences if they do not.
- our ethical responsibilities as humans.

Theme vs. Topic

• a criticism about fashionable or popular customs, ideas or values and the consequences not just for the individual but for society as a whole who demonstrate such attitudes

Common Mistakes

- Theme is NOT an obvious or simple statement (ie. Don't steal. It is wrong to kill.)
- Theme does not mention specific characters and events in a story.
- Many confuse topic and theme, but theme cannot be expressed in a single word (ie. love).
- A theme is NOT a cliché an over-used saying such as "Money can't buy happiness," "Love conquers all," or "It's better to give than receive."

Topic - a word or phrase describing the main subject of a text (ie. what the text is mostly about).
